I ven though Andrew Lord borrows forms from such diverse I sources as Chinese ceramics, Meissen, Delft, Staffordshire, and even pre-Columbian pottery, his pieces have in common their clay beginnings (5 Pieces. Round. Tin and Copper, bottom left). A transplanted Englishman, Lord creates beautifully crafted vessels with subtle glazes, and more recently employs a metallic bronze patina. "During the last few years I have been making pieces that come out of the seven steps of manipulating clay: modeling, marking, pressing, holding, palming, punching, and squeezing," says Lord.
