

Gladstone Gallery to represent Keith Haring

Gladstone Gallery has announced that it will begin to represent the work of Keith Haring. The gallery's relationship with Haring began in 1982, when Barbara Gladstone commissioned a series of lithographs to artist, which were the first prints Haring ever made.

Haring (1958-1990) was a brilliantly inventive and prolific artist, performer, and filmmaker, who forged new artistic territories throughout his life and work that profoundly reflected his deep insight and involvement in the cultural zeitgeist of his day. Keith Haring died in 1990 of AIDS-related illnesses at the age of 31 in New York. Since his death he has been the subject of several international retrospectives, the most recent being, "Keith Haring: 1978-1982," at the Kunsthalle Wien (Vienna). The exhibition will travel to the Contemporary Arts Center in Cincinnati, Ohio and remain on view from February 26 through September 5, 2011.

The Gallery plans to mount its first exhibition of Haring's work at its 21st Street space in New York in May 2011.
