Fall's Can't-Miss Art Shows

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Next week, Richard Serra and Matthew Barney tee off in Chelsea, Serra with two new monumental steel sculptures at Gagosian Gallery (555 West Twenty-fourth Street) and Barney with three at Gladstone Gallery (530 West Twenty-first Street), the latter's first major works produced from traditional heavyweight metals such as iron, bronze, lead, and copper. Painting takes a strong stand uptown with Gabriel Orozco's stunningly complex, geometric works at Marian Goodman Gallery (24 West Fifty-seventh Street), and Jenny Saville's huge fleshy and highly sensuous canvases of the human body at Gagosian Gallery (980 Madison Avenue). Both artists present life-size drawings: Orozco's folded-body images and Saville's Renaissance Nativity-like portraits (opening on September 15). But whatever you do, don't miss John Elderfield's brilliant and far-reaching de Kooning retrospective at the Modern (September 18—January 9). The show covers seven decades and represents nearly every type of work de Kooning made, including some of his most famous paintings: Pink Angels, Excavation, and the third Woman series from 1950—53.

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
